**MESSAGE FROM JONA**

This week's reading is Matthew 22:15-22, I encourage you to stop and read it now. It seems to me that the heart of this passage are the words of Jesus, "give to God what is God's." The inevitable question that follows such a statement is, what is God's?

The psalmist answers this question when proclaiming, "the earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who dwell in it." (Ps 24:1)

I wonder, if we saw everything and everyone as belonging to God (rather than to us or to someone else), then how would this change how we treat each other? How would it change how we treat the environment and the earth's resources? How would it change how we use our resources?

If God has given everything then that includes the very life within us, so how do we give that back to God as Jesus commanded? I believe the witness of the disciples is that we give back to God by seeking to follow and trust Jesus as best we can - even if that is sometimes flawed! I believe it's about saying our purpose is not to be self-seeking or to glorify ourselves, but to seek God first and glorify Him. Let's be honest, this isn't easy to do because, as human beings, we're prone to look no further than our own lives and immediate surroundings. It requires momentary awareness and choice on our part, as well a deep ongoing transformation by the Spirit. Change of understanding and living doesn't happen overnight but we must be committed in the long term to allow ourselves to be changed over time.

Take time to reflect on these challenges.
