**LET THE LOVE OF JESUS BE KNOWN**

**12<sup>th</sup> in Ordinary Time // Called to Love**

**MESSAGE FROM JONA**

This week's set Gospel is **Mark 4:35-41**. It is the story of Jesus sleeping in the boat before waking to calm the storm which has the disciples full of worry and fear. I encourage you to slowly and prayerfully read it; what does it say to you?

As I did this, I was reminded that storms happen in life but that often the storm that rages within us is as devastating and powerful as any around us. The real storm, the more threatening storm is often the one that churns and rages within. That interior storm is the one that blows us off course, beats against our faith, and threatens to drown us. Fear, vulnerability, worry and powerlessness can all blow within us. The sense of abandonment, fear of the unknown, the sense of being out of control, are just some of these inner waves that pound us.

"Peace! Be still!" Jesus speaks to the wind and the sea. But Jesus isn't changing the weather as much as inviting the disciples to change. He's speaking to the wind and the waves around them but, more importantly, he is speaking to the wind and the waves within them. The disciples have been pointing to what is going on outside them. Jesus now points to what is going on inside them: "Peace! Be still!" He invites the disciples into calmness and to share in his peace.

Perhaps you need to hear Jesus speaking this today. "Peace! Be still!"

**Church Council and Reopening for Worship** This week the Church Council agreed to delay reopening in tune with the government's delay in the final easing of restrictions; this means a **4 week delay** with a reopening date of **25<sup>th</sup> July**. This decision was not taken lightly as there is recognition that some people are desperate to get back, while others remain more cautious and would rather wait. I urge each of us to remember those who might feel differently, and to "be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." (Ephesians 4:2)
