Happy New Year!

It feels strange to be saying that in writing rather than in person and we must recognise that, for many people, the current period doesn't feel very happy. The dark nights, the cold weather, the prolonged restrictions, the move to tier 4, the lack of seeing people we know and love - all of these things are taking their toll meaning that it might not feel 'happy.' We can see a light at the end of the tunnel with the authorisation of two vaccines, but yet the light feels just out of reach as we don't know for how many more months we'll be living with restrictions. Please be assured of my prayers and support at this time and please feel free to contact me if I can help in any way or you just want a listening ear.

It's important in the midst of all that is going on that we don't lose our focus on God. This Sunday is when we renew our covenant with God. The Methodist covenant prayer can help us think about our lives, witness and service in a way I find both challenging and encouraging. I share it with you for your own use and reflection:

Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; Put me to doing, put me to suffering; let me be employed for you or laid aside for you, exalted for you or brought low for you, let me be full, let me be empty, Let me have all things, let me have nothing; I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now glorious and blessed God, Father Son and Holy Spirit, You are mine and I am yours. So be it.

And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven.
